A Person-Centered, Evidence-Based Approach to Chronic Pain

Our Veteran and Family Well-Being Series will be held virtually this fall, co-hosted by LGen (Ret'd) Eric B. Schoomaker, 42nd US Army Surgeon General, and LGen (Ret'd) Michel Maisonneuve, Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). The series will feature a collaboration of respected speakers drawn from the Chronic Pain Centre of Excellence for Canadian Veterans, United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), and United States Department of Defense (DoD). The aim of the series is to provide education on the evolution of pain management and current best practices in evidence-based interdisciplinary care. Targeting a broad audience of Veterans, case managers, and health care professionals, the series will be accessible in both English and French.



The Chronic Pain Centre of Excellence for Canadian Veterans was established to conduct research and help improve the well-being of CAF Veterans, and their families, suffering from chronic pain. Funded by Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC), the not-for-profit organization is working to improve the ability to treat pain with evidence-based recommendations. Ongoing research includes the effectiveness of cannabis in managing chronic pain, impact of sex/gender on pain experience and the response to therapy, and the effectiveness of virtual care.
